Giving Thanks in All Seasons

From the Pastor's Desk

November is always a month of gratitude. The harvest is gathered in, the air turns crisp, and Thanksgiving invites us to pause and remember God's blessings. Yet this year, our hearts hold a mix of emotions—gratitude and sadness, thanksgiving and anxiety—as our congregation prepares for a pastoral transition.

It's natural to feel uncertain when a chapter comes to a close. Change—especially in the life of a congregation—can stir up questions and worries: *What will come next? Who will lead us? How will things change?* These are faithful questions, because they come from love for this community and a deep desire to see it thrive.

But even in seasons of uncertainty, God's Word reminds us, *"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God"* (Philippians 4:6). Notice that St. Paul links thanksgiving with trust. Gratitude isn't only for the easy seasons; it's an act of faith in the midst of change. When we give thanks, we proclaim that God has been faithful in the past—and will continue to be faithful in the days ahead.

As I prepare to step away after these many years together, my heart overflows with thanksgiving for you—the people who have prayed, served, laughed, and worshiped alongside me. I give thanks for the baptisms and funerals, the confirmations and pot-lucks, the quiet prayers and joyful songs that have filled these years with meaning. Most of all, I give thanks for the steadfast presence of Christ who has walked with us every step of the way.

This congregation belongs to God. Christ is the true Shepherd of the Church, and he will guide you through this time of transition toward a new season of ministry and mission. Give thanks for what has been, and trust the One who makes all things new.

May this Thanksgiving be filled with peace that passes understanding, gratitude that steadies anxious hearts, and faith that looks forward with hope.

Applying Bible Principles

Stewardship and Thanksgiving Day: Living with Grateful Hearts

As the leaves fall and Thanksgiving Day approaches, we are reminded that gratitude is more than a moment at the dinner table—it's a way of life. For Christians, thanksgiving is not just an annual holiday; it is the posture of a faithful heart. Every prayer, every act of service, and every gift we offer becomes a reflection of our gratitude to God, who has given us everything we have and are.

Stewardship is, at its core, thanksgiving in action. When we speak of “stewardship,” we often think of budgets, pledges, and church finances. But true stewardship begins long before the offering plate is passed. It starts in the recognition that all we have—our time, talents, possessions, and even our very breath—are gifts from God, entrusted to our care. We are not owners but caretakers, invited to use God's gifts for God's purposes.

Thanksgiving calls us to remember how richly God has blessed us. In Deuteronomy, the people of Israel were told to bring the first fruits of their harvest and present them before the Lord with these words: “*Now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me*” (Deuteronomy 26:10). Their offering was not payment, but praise. Likewise, our offerings—whether given in worship, in service, or in kindness to others—are expressions of gratitude for the abundance of God's grace.

This season, as we gather around our tables and give thanks for family, food, and fellowship, let us also pause to consider how we might live thankfully every day. How might we share our blessings with those in need? How might we give our time to strengthen our community of faith? How might we make gratitude visible through generosity?

Thanksgiving and stewardship are two sides of the same coin: one recognizes the gifts, and the other puts them to work. Together, they form a life shaped by grace—a life that joyfully responds, “Thank you, Lord, for all you have done.”

“Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever.” — *Psalms 107:1*
