From the Pastor

"A Christmas Farewell"

Dear Beloved Members and Friends of Redeemer,

As we enter the holy season of Advent and Christmas, I find myself anticipating these familiar celebrations in a different way. After more than twenty years serving as your pastor, this

December marks my final month among you in this role. Writing these words brings a mixture of gratitude, humility, and bittersweet joy.

Christmastime has always held a special place in our life together. I think of all the candlelit hymns we've sung, the children's Christmas programs that brought both laughter and tears, the trees decorated by so many caring hands, and the countless ways we have proclaimed together that *Christ is born for us*. These memories will remain among the great treasures of my ministry.

This year, as I prepare to retire, the message of Christmas feels especially profound. The birth of Jesus reminds us that God is always doing something new—often quietly, often in ways we do not fully understand at first, but always for our good. The manger teaches us that God enters our lives not only in moments of stability, but also in times of transition, uncertainty, and change. Emmanuel—God with us—is the promise that holds steady when everything else feels in motion.

I want to say thank you. Thank you for the privilege of walking with you through life's holiest moments—baptisms and confirmations, weddings and funerals, joys and sorrows. Thank you for the trust you placed in me, for your prayers, your patience, your honesty, your humor, your partnership in ministry, and your love. Serving as your pastor has shaped me in ways I will carry for the rest of my life.

Though I am stepping away from pastoral leadership at Redeemer, I believe wholeheartedly that God has already prepared the path ahead—for you and for me. This congregation is strong, faithful, resilient, and filled with gifts. The Holy Spirit will continue to guide you as you discern new leadership and move into the next chapter of your ministry. I will be cheering you on, praying for you, and trusting, as always, that Christ is at work in your midst.

My final worship service with you will be on December 21. I hope we can share that day together—giving thanks for the past, celebrating the present, and entrusting the future to God's care.

In this season when angels declare "Do not be afraid," may those words settle deeply into your hearts. Christ has come. Christ is with us. Christ is leading us forward.

Applying Bible Principles

As we move through the season of Advent and approach the joy of Christmas, we are surrounded once again by a familiar message: "For God so loved the world that he gave..." At its heart, Christmas is a story of divine generosity. God gives Himself—vulnerable, small, wrapped in swaddling cloths and laid in a manger. Every gift we exchange in this season echoes that first and greatest gift: God's love made flesh in Jesus Christ.

Because of this, Christmas is naturally a time to reflect on stewardship. We often think of stewardship as budgets, pledge cards, and committee meetings. But at its core, stewardship is simply our response to God's grace. It is the daily practice of using all that God entrusts to us—our time, our abilities, our possessions—for God's purposes in the world.

Christmas invites us to examine our relationship with giving from a place of gratitude rather than obligation. The shepherds leave their flocks to witness the miracle. The magi travel far and offer gifts that honor the Christ child. Mary and Joseph offer their trust and obedience. Each gives from what they have, and each gift reveals a heart tuned toward God.

Stewardship during the Christmas season is not primarily about how much we can give, but how faithfully we can reflect the generosity God has already shown us. When we give generously, we are participating in God's work of bringing hope, mercy, and renewal into the world. When we serve, volunteer, or simply share kindness with someone who feels forgotten, we are practicing the very stewardship the gospel calls us to.

This season also asks us to remember that faithful stewardship happens not just in December, but throughout the year. The needs of the church continue after the last carol is sung. Ministry goes on long after the candles in the windows are packed away. As we reflect on God's abundant blessings this Christmas, we can make commitments for the coming year—commitments to serve with joy, to give with purpose, and to grow in our discipleship.

The miracle of Christmas is that God meets us where we are and gives us more than we could ever earn or imagine. Our stewardship is simply the grateful response of hearts touched by that grace. May this season renew in us the desire to give generously, live faithfully, and shine the light of Christ in all we do.

Merry Christmas, and may God's gifts of peace and joy be with you richly.
