EPIPHANY: A SEASON OF LIGHT AND REVELATION

As we enter another new year, in the Church year, we also enter a new season—the season of Epiphany—the season of light.

This is when the wise men found the baby Jesus and offered Him gifts; we observe Jesus' baptism; and the miracle at the Wedding of Cana. Epiphany is also called the season of light. We focus especially on the light shining in the darkness, and the true light that enlightens all people. In holy baptism we hand the newly initiated a candle, saying, 'let your light so shine before others....'

And so it is with the coming New Year at Redeemer. We need the light of Jesus' love to guide and direct us as we face the challenges before us. We need the Season of Light.

Right now we are in "transition" - that period of comfort when for 22 years, we had Pastor Jon as our leader and now we must transition to new and unsure conditions—from what may seem as the darkness to the light. Rest assured that we are not alone. First of all the S W Synod with offices in Glendale, under the leadership of Bishop Brenda Bos, has our back. We have been assigned a transition coach and the Redeemer Council has formed a transition team; Laura Haywood, Dakota Warren, Julie Griffith and Jack Clayton. The coach is Pastor Jon Gathji who is an interim pastor in Omaha. Not to worry about distance, with the availability of technology, digital meetings such as zoom are easily arranged.

The Christmas season slowed the process a bit, but now we can press forward. First off, Pastor Bryan will be available the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the months through March—those dates are flexible. If we get an interim before March, Pastor Bryan will step aside. The other Sundays will be lead by supply Pastors and/or lay-led worship. (If anyone knows of speakers, retired Pastors, etc., please let us know and hopefully we can schedule them for a service.)

The transition team will have work for you as your thoughts and opinions are an important part of this process. As a congregation, we have to determine our objectives for the future, such as what our budget can handle, are we looking for fulltime or part-time leadership, etc. While this is taking place the Synod will be searching for an interim pastor for us.

When the results of the transition are satisfactory to our congregation, a Call Committee will be formed and with the help of the Synod, the process of locating a Pastor will begin.

As you can see this is quite a process. We need your prayers, continued support and the guidance of God's Light as we walk this journey in search of a Pastor to lead us. We ask for God's Blessings as we greet a new year and most certainly a new year filled with challenges.

AMERICA'S ANNIVERSARY

In recognition of the upcoming 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence, the church council has designated the monthly charity as the Kern Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR).

The SAR honors our patriot ancestors and all veterans, serves our communities and educates the future generations of our country's founding principles.

Some examples of these activities include the following. The SAR has partnered with the Elizabeth Dole Foundation (a national organization focused on helping veterans, especially those struggling with suicide.) They participate in various parades and ceremonies honoring our veterans, such as Memorial Day and Veteran's Day. They also are a supporter of the Wreaths Across America program, placing wreaths and honoring veterans that have passed. They also award and recognize local veterans.

The SAR presents awards and recognizes local law enforcement, fire fighters, and other first responders. The group participates in honorable flag retirement on Flag Day.

The SAR presents at school assemblies. Giving live education to the students. They provide a number of awards, scholarships, and competition for students of all ages. Some examples are poster contests for 5th grade, brochure for 8th, plus essay and oration contests for high schoolers. A youth Video Contest exists for 6th-12th grade. There are even scholarship contests for school teachers of American History, and educators in general.

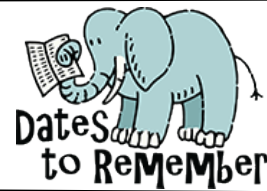
