Jesus provided an insightful answer to that question in Matthew 6:20-21, where He said, "... store up riches for yourselves in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and robbers cannot break in and steal. KNITTING MACHINE LESSONS: November & December will be cancelled unless time allows. Karen will keep us informed . Regular schedule starting in January.




