



What's the most important thing about Lent? It depends on who you ask, but Lent has become a significant time in our Christian calendar, observed by nearly all denominations. The practices will vary, but the common themes include:

Pastor's Message A Meaningful Preparation for Easter

for **Lent** This forty-day season provides time for reflection and meditation leading up to Easter, which is the central event of our faith. The resurrection of Jesus Christ has changed everything and our annual celebration of God's triumph over death is enhanced by thoughtful preparation.

Fasting and Abstinence

Many Christians observe Lent through acts of self-discipline, including fasting and abstaining from certain foods or activities. Self-denial is almost a heresy in our "be happy" culture but has always been an excellent way to focus on spiritual growth.

Repentance and Reflection

Lent is a time for believers to reflect on their lives, engage in repentance for their sins, and seek spiritual renewal. It often involves a commitment to prayer, penance, and acts of charity.

Symbolic and Sacramental Practices

Different traditions have specific symbolic practices during Lent. For example, the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday symbolizes mortality and repentance. The use of purple, the liturgical color during Lent signifies both sorrow and royalty. Our King dies but will rise again. A renewed focus on the cross is appropriate as well. "We preach Christ crucified." 1 Corinthians 1:23

Renewed Commitment to Christ

Lent serves as a period for believers to reevaluate our commitment to Christ and to deepen our relationship with God. It is an opportunity for spiritual growth, self-examination, and a renewed focus on living a Christian life.

Ultimately, the most important thing about Lent is the personal and communal journey of faith, selfdiscipline, and spiritual reflection that it provides for Christians as we eagerly await the celebration of Easter. The specific practices and emphasis will vary among us, but the overarching theme is one of preparation and renewal. May you all have a blessed Lent.

Applying Bible Principles Stewardship Thoughts

"You will have all you want to eat, and you will give thanks to the Lord your God for the fertile land that he has given you. . . .Remember that it is the Lord your God who gives you the power to become rich. . ." (Deut. 8:10, 18).

The Bible repeatedly says that we are to "praise the Lord," or as some translations read, we are to "bless the Lord." But what does that mean? Whatever else it might mean, it entails having a thankful heart for all that God has done for us. It's easy, you know, to go to an extreme and to emphasize only God's spiritual blessings to the exclusion of His temporal blessings. It's also easy to emphasize only His material blessings and to forget His provisions for us spiritually. In reality, we are to emphasize both the material and spiritual blessings we receive from God, remembering that all that we have comes from His bountiful hand.

As we realize God's provisions for us, day after day, week after week, month after month, and year after year, we literally "praise the Lord" by a lifestyle that is marked by thanksgiving for all that God has done for us. And that spirit of gratitude for past, present and future blessings causes us to want to give to the Lord from the bounty He has provided for us. As one unknown author wrote, "Thanksgiving, to be truly Thanks-giving, is first thanks, then giving."

Think about it: As we receive God's blessings, we offer praise and thanksgiving to Him. And as we realize afresh that all that we have is a result of God's goodness, our response to His faithfulness is to give back to God a portion of that which was already His. We do so, not because we have to or out of any sense of obligation or guilt. We give to the Lord because we want to do so, in response to His great love for us and in response to His goodness.

Dwight L. Moody was once reading Psalm 103. When he came to the verse which describes how we are to praise the Lord and to remember His benefits, Mr. Moody stopped short in his inimitable way and exclaimed, "You can't remember them all, of course, but don't forget them all. Remember some of them!" And as you "remember some of them," remember the sequence: First thanks, then giving.
